

Early Education Development Team Statutory Related Training Opportunities

The Early Education Development Team is working in partnership with the City Council's Business Training Unit to offer Early Years settings and practitioners this training at a competitive rate.

The dates detailed here are specific courses that the Early Education Development Team and the Business Training Unit are working in partnership to provide for Early Years settings.

Paediatric First Aid

The course provides theoretical and practical training in First Aid techniques that are specific to infants aged 0 to 1 year and children aged from 1 year to the onset of puberty.

Candidates will become familiar with the role of the paediatric first aider and be able to assess and react appropriately to an emergency situation including being able to provide first aid for a child and an infant who:

- is unresponsive and needs to receive CPR
- has an airway obstruction
- is suffering from shock
- is wounded and bleeding
- has a fracture or dislocation
- has a head, neck or back injury
- has a condition effecting the eyes, ears or nose
- has a chronic medical condition or sudden illness
- is experiencing the effects of extreme heat and/or cold
- has been poisoned
- has been bitten or stung
- has sustained an electric shock

The Paediatric First Aid consists of 2 units and is delivered over a period of 2 days. The course also includes details on first aid kits and recording accidents.

All candidates are continually assessed by the trainer during the course and all successful candidates will be awarded a Paediatric First Aid certificate which is valid for a period of 3 years along with a wallet sized plastic card detailing their qualifications.

This course meets the requirements laid down by Ofsted for Childcare workers.

All First Aid courses have a practical assessment and therefore all learners must be able to take part in these assessments and have the ability to get on the floor to demonstrate CPR, and to put a casualty in to recovery position. Reasonable adjustments can be made during practice sessions, but CPR must be carried out on the floor for the final assessment. If you would like to discuss any mobility issues, please contact us.

What do I need to bring with me?

A course booklet will be provided, but it may help to bring a notepad and pen to make your own notes.

It is a requirement of some awarding bodies that candidates show photographic identification on the day of an exam. This can be in the form of work ID, passport, driving license, student ID, bus pass etc.

Is food/drink available on the course?

Drinks are provided on all courses, but lunches are not provided.

- The practitioner understands the content of the training they are attending and what learning outcomes are expected

Cancellations are only accepted in exceptional circumstances, **fees are non-refundable.** If exceptional circumstances are agreed fees paid can be held in credit for your setting for future training.
