
Safeguarding Contextual safeguarding



Contextual Safeguarding is an approach to understanding, and responding to, young people's experiences of significant harm beyond their families. Contextual Safeguarding, therefore, expands the objectives of child protection systems in recognition that young people are vulnerable to abuse beyond their front doors.
