- Do you have a wide variety and styles of books and written materials, including fiction and nonfiction e.g., cookery, maps, recipe cards, photobooks of the children from the setting?

- Do your books reflect diversity of languages, cultures, character and experiences?
- Do they contain, stories/rhymes/poems?
- How do you ensure books have purpose and link with activities?
- What props do you use to engage the children?
- Do you have a number of the same book for children to share and compare together?
- Do you have books displayed in a variety of interesting ways that triggers curiosity?
