Fay Bayliss, NHS Director of Nursing (LLR):

Phase 3: Building on what works

With the success of Phase 2 and the recent announcement by Minister McKinnell extending Early Language Support for Every Child (ELSEC) and the wider Change Programme, we now move confidently into Phase 3.

This next phase includes:

- New workstreams: SEN Units and Resourced Provisions; Local Inclusion Support Offers; and Assistive Technology Lending Libraries
- Ongoing areas: ELSEC, PINS, AP & APST, ND Inclusion
- Concluding projects: National Standards testing, Advice & Information, Digital innovation pilots

With 14 workstreams ranging from ELSEC and AP to new initiatives, our focus shifts towards embedding inclusive practices that are scalable, sustainable and impactful.



Our new look: Introducing the Alliance brand

We're excited to unveil the new SEND & Inclusion Alliance branding – including logos, colours, templates and accessibility guidance.

The logo development has been through rounds of consultation from stakeholders across the programme, feedback from our young people, and partners. It has been built around values of **inclusion**, **clarity and accessibility** and has been shaped by how children, and young people engage with brands today. In keeping with our aim to use to use the best available science in everything we do the design uses:

- Colours that reflect energy and clarity
- Shapes that symbolise partnership, growth, inclusion and strength
